Skill Level

Intermediate

Finished Size

8" x 66" (20.3cm x 168cm)

Materials

- Willow Yarns™ Veil  (100% Egyptian Giza Mercerized Cotton; 50g/306yd)
-733285-0010 Ginger (3 balls)
- US size C-2 (2.75mm) hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

Gauge

26 dc x 13 rows = 4" (10.2cm)

Save time, check your gauge.

Stitch Guide

picot: Ch 3, sl st in top of last dc.

Pattern Note

- Scarf is constructed in 2 halves from the center out.



Instructions

First Half

Loosely ch 52.

Row 1 (RS): 4 dc in eighth ch from hook, *ch 1, sk 3 chs, dc in next ch**, ch 1, sk 3 chs, 4 dc in next ch; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, turn—six 4-dc fans.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1 throughout), sk next ch-1 sp, *dc in next 4 dc**, ch 3, sk next dc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Row 3: Ch 4, sk ch-1 sp, *dc2tog over next 2 dc, ch 2, dc2tog over next 2 dc**, ch 3; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, dc in third ch of beg ch 4, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc throughout), *(dc, ch 1, dc) in dc2tog, ch 2, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next dc2tog**, ch 1; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in third ch of beg ch 4, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first dc, *dc in next ch-1 sp, 5 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next ch-1 sp**, sc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 6: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), *sk 3 dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, dc in next sc**, ch 3; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, turn.

Row 7: Ch 3, dc in first dc, *ch 1, dc in next sc, ch 1**, 4 dc in next dc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in third ch of beg ch 6, turn.

Row 8: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in next dc, *ch 3**, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in next dc, dc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 9: Ch 3, dc2tog over first 2 dc, *ch 3, dc2tog over next 2 dc**, ch 2, dc2tog over next 2 dc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, dc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 10: Ch 3, dc in first dc, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in next dc, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next dc**, ch 2; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 11: Ch 3, 2 dc in first dc, *dc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next ch-1 sp**, 5 dc in ch-2 sp; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first dc, *ch 3, dc in next sc, ch 3, sk 3 dc**, sc in next dc; rep from *

ABBREVIATIONS

- approx:** approximately
beg: begin/beginning
ch/chs: chain/chains
cm: centimeter
dc: double crochet
dc2tog: double crochet 2 stitches together
rep: repeat/repeats
RS: right side
sc: single crochet
sk: skip
sl st: slip stitch
sp: space
st/sts: stitch/stitches
WS: wrong side

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across, ending last rep at **, sc in third ch of beg ch 3, turn.

Row 13: Ch 4, *4 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next sc**, ch 1; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, turn.

Rep Rows 2-13 until half measures approx 33" (84cm), ending with Row 4.

Fasten off.

Second Half

Join yarn base of last dc of Row 1 of first half, with RS facing, ready to work across foundation ch.

Note: Row 1 of the second half will mirror Row 1 of the first half, you'll be working into the same ch sts.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 4, *sk 3 ch, 4 dc in next ch, sk 3 ch, dc in next ch; rep from * 5 more times, turn.

Rep Rows 2-13 of first half until second half measures approx 33" (84cm), ending with Row 4, turn, do not fasten off.

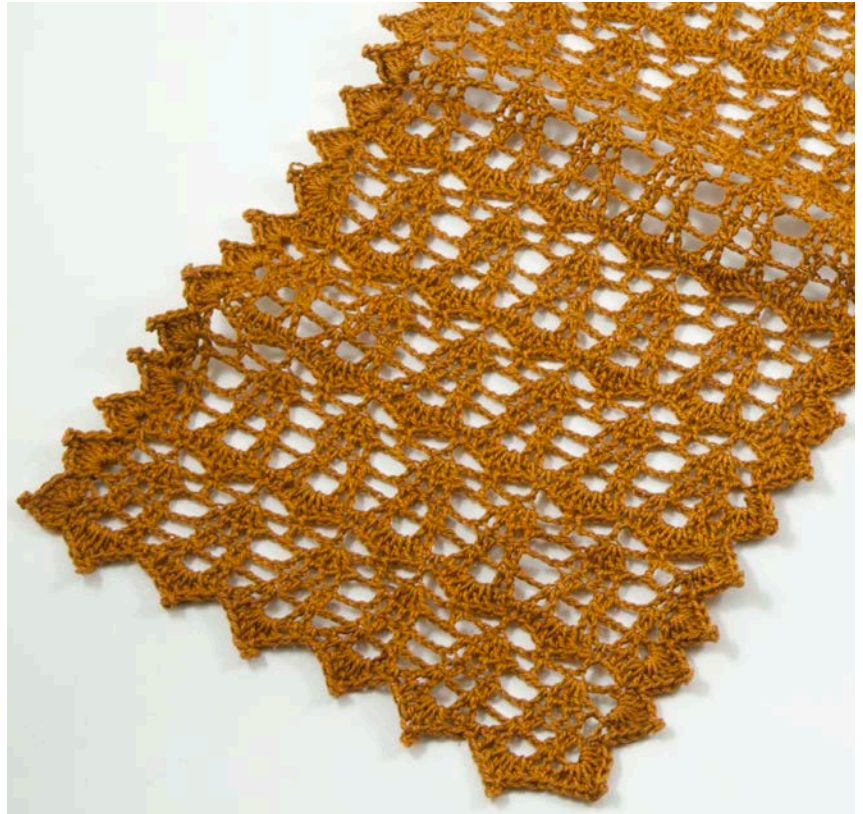
Edging

Ch 1, sc in first dc, *[dc in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, picot, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp, dc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp] across, ending with sc in top of beg ch 3, turn to work across long edge of scarf, (**note:** you will be working in ch-3 sps and dc posts along edge) [sk next sp or dc-post, (4 dc, picot, 3 dc) in next sp or dc-post, sc in base of next sp or post] across to next short side adjusting as necessary so last sc is in corner, turn to work across short side; rep from * once more, sl st in first sc to join. Fasten off.

Finishing

Weave in ends.

Block, pinning out each picot.



PROJECT TIP

Organize Your Supplies

Knitting and crocheting is easier and more enjoyable when your supplies are accessible and organized. Try keeping a notebook of information on the yarn in your stash, including brand, color name or number, weight, care instructions, and amount that you have left. Update the list regularly so you always know what you have on hand. Also, keep your needles and hooks organized by size so they are easy to access for each project.
