Spring Water Chevron Scarf

Skill Level

Easy

Finished Size

6" x 56" (15.2cm x 142cm)
circumference

Materials



- Willow Yarns™ Verbena (75% superwash wool/25% nylon; 100g/370yd)
-730265-0964 Spring Water (1 ball)
- US size G-6 (4mm) crochet hook or size to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

Gauge

28 sts x 9 rows = 4" (10.2cm),
blocked

Stitch Guide

dc2tog (double crochet 2

together): Yo insert hook into indicated st, yo, pull through 2 lps, sk indicated sts, yo, insert hook into next st, yo, pull through 2 lps, yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Pattern Notes

- Beg ch 2 counts as dc.
- Dc2tog counts as 1 st.

Instructions

Ch 42.

Row 1: Dc in third ch from hook, dc in next 2 chs, dc2tog (sk 2 chs bet dc), *dc in next 3 chs, ch 2, dc in next 3 chs, dc2tog (sk 2 chs bet dc); rep from * to last 3 chs, dc in next 2 chs, 2 dc in last ch, turn—30 dc.

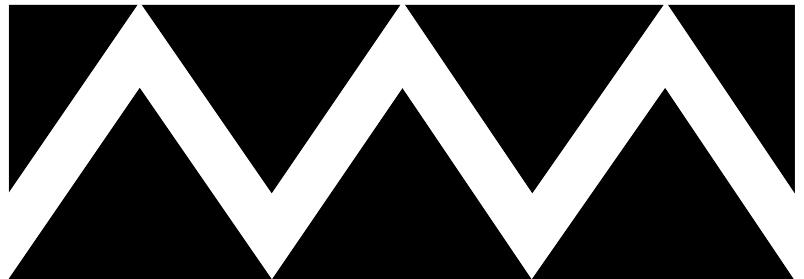
Row 2: Ch 2, dc in first dc, dc in next 2 dc, dc2tog (sk dc2tog bet dc), *dc

in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in ch-2 sp, dc in next 2 dc, dc2tog (sk dc2tog bet dc); rep from * to last 3 dc, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn.

Rows 3-120: Rep Row 2.

Fasten off and wet block.

When scarf is dry, line up short ends tog so the chevron points of one end fill in the V of the other end. Sew tog. Weave in ends.
