Skill Level

Intermediate

Finished Size

40" x 50" (102cm x 127cm)

Materials



- Willow Yarns™ Jubilee (88% cotton/12% polyester; 100g/317yd)
 - 732999-0937 Winterberry (3 balls): A
 - 732999-0960 Fired Brick (2 balls): B
 - 732999-0938 Sugar Cookie (3 balls): C
- US size H-8 (5mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

Gauge

7 v-sts and 10 rows = 4" (10.2cm)

Save time, check your gauge.

Stitch Guide

sh (shell): (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in same st or sp.

v-st (v-stitch): (Dc, ch 1, dc) in same st or sp.

cdc (center double crochet):

Worked the same as a regular dc, the only difference is where the stitch is placed. Insert hook from front below the top 3 lps of the dc, yo, and complete dc as normally worked.

FPdc (Front Post double

crochet): Yo, insert hook from front to back to front around post of st indicated and draw up a lp, (yo and draw through 2 lps on hook) twice.

BPdc (Back Post double

crochet): Yo, insert hook from back to front to back around post of st indicated and draw up a lp, (yo and draw through 2 lps on hook) twice.

Pattern Notes

- Throw is worked in strips from a center ch out to the ends, allowing for a sweet flow.
- The edge is added, and then the panels are crocheted tog in mile a minute fashion.
- Cdc stitches are used on the edges of each strip to add structure and provide a great base for the joining rows.

Instructions

Strip 1 (make 3 in A)

First Half

Ch 25.

Row 1: Dc in fourth ch from hook, dc in next ch, (sk 2 chs, sh in next ch, sk 2 chs, dc in next ch) twice, sk 2 chs, sh, sk 2 chs, dc in next 3 chs.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3, turn, cdc, (FPdc on dc, sh in ch sp of next sh) 3 times, *FPdc on next, cdc in last 2 sts.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, cdc, (BPdc on dc, sh in ch sp of next sh) 3 times, BPdc on next, cdc in last 2 dc.

Rep Rows 2-3 twenty-seven times.

Rep Row 2 once more—58 completed rows.

Second Half

Join same yarn at tail edge of beg ch and rep Rows 1-58. After Second Half is complete, move on to edging. Work the edging on only 1 side of 2 strips. Work edging on both sides of 1 strip.

Edging

Note: Work edging on both sides of 1 strip, left long side of 1 strip, and right long side of last strip.

Row 1: Join C in last pull through of the final dc on strip, rotate to work down length of strip. Sc in top section, *sc on post of dc, ch 1, sc on post of next dc; rep from * to last dc post, sc on post, sc in the top of the last dc—118 sc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, sc in ch-1 sp, *ch 3, sc in next ch sp; rep from * to last ch sp, ch 1, sk 1 sc, dc in last sc.

Row 3: Turn, sc in top of dc, *ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp; rep from * to last ch sp, ch 3, sc in top of dc.

Row 4: Turn, sc in top of sc, and in ch sp, *ch 1, sc in next ch sp; rep from * to last ch sp, sc in ch sp, and last st of row. Fasten off.

Strip 2 (make 2 in B)

First Half

Ch 37.

Row 1: Dc in fourth ch from the hook, and the next ch, *sk 2 chs, v-st in next ch; rep from * to last 5 chs, sk 2 chs, dc in last 3 chs.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 2, cdc in next dc, FPdc on next st, v-st in each v-st across, FPdc on next dc, cdc in last 2 dc.

Row 3: Ch 2, cdc in next st, BPdc on next st, v-st in each v-st across, BPdc on next dc, cdc in last 2 dc.

Rep Rows 2-3 twenty-seven more times.

Rep Row 2 once more—58 total rows.

Second Half

Join B at tail edge of beg ch and rep Rows 1-58.

Edging

Rep Strip 1 Edging, working on both sides of each Strip 2.

Joining

Matching C edges, line up a Strip 1 with a Strip 2. With C, sc in first strip, ch 1, sc in second strip, *ch 1, sc in ch-1 sp on first strip, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp on second strip; rep from * to last ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next st, ch 1, sc in last sc on second strip. Fasten off. Rep, alternating Strip 1 and Strip 2, until all strips are joined.

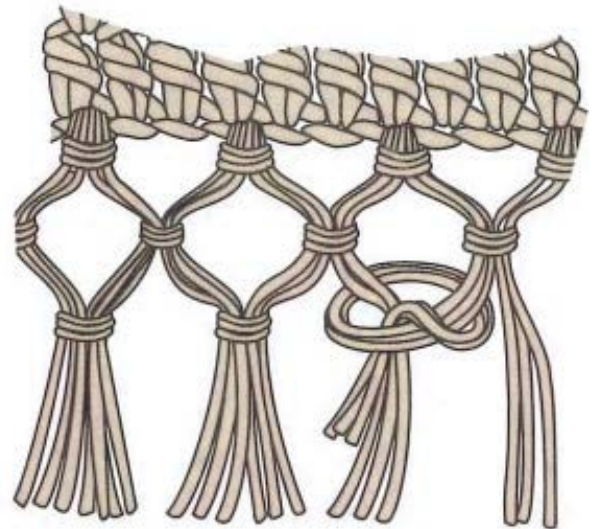
Weave ends.

Knotted Tassels

Cut strands 17½" (44cm) long to coordinate with row ends—108 A, 96 B, and 96 C.

Group strands in sets of 6 of the same color, fold in half, and secure using latch-hook fashion. Be sure to keep the cover lps on the right side of your throw. Once all the strands are affixed, divide into groups of 6 strands from two adjoining main groups. Use the diagram to guide you through wrapping the knots.

Work one pass the width of the throw, then rep, working the second pass.
